read Henry Aetna Jun: born at Staatsburg. I live there now - That he was a passenger on Board that there were five guns or muskets & two pistols & Cartouches ~~Berghs~~ on Board of ~~Dops~~ Dops Sloop - That David Dops the Captain was at the Helms - That the Licut: Asked what he had on Board Dops answered wood & the ordered him to come to. the Transport took six Cord of wood & the man of war four Cord - That there was Butter on Board belonging to Triligh

That when they were hailed they were about 200 yards of from her -

That the next day after the Sloop lay to the Transport and an old man an Officer man came on Board & told them 600 hundred Men were watching them and would burn the Sloop if she was taken - A pettycouser in the Evening came alongside & truck again Dops Sloop & a man fell over board he was taken up & after he was dried went on board of the Transport five Dops on Board, two Berghs - five passengers Doughty Rivers Triligh Martin Seaman & himself -

That Capt. Campbell promised him good Wages to enlist & go to Boston & promised him Bounty & 400 Acres of land if he would enlist for three years -

That at the Training he heard them busy about Whig & Tory that Doughty & Berghs made themselves busy about those matters - That Tim Doughty drank a Health to the King & the Tories and a Downfall to the Whigs -

That he and Daniel Rivers, & Abraham Triligh ~~wanted~~ ~~to~~ ~~go~~ ~~on~~ ~~shore~~ ~~and~~ could not get Liberty to go, or to set on shore -

read Abraham Triligh - born in Ulster County - lives in Charlotte precinct in Dutchess County near his father John Triligh - left home last Monday week came down in Dops Sloop as a passenger - he had three furlings of Butter on Board which Adam Bergh sold & received the money & gave to the Examiant - That when they were hailed they were nearer to the Transport than the City - That he heard the Berghs say they would go on Board & see the Ship - That when they were hailed one of the Dops was at the helms - That he heard Bergh say that they were <sup>not</sup> afraid & had been threatened by the Country people - That At the choosing of officers the Berghs were there, there was a dispute between Radley & one of the Berghs -

That Bergh <sup>not (wanting to) or caught by the soldiers, but had</sup> said he did not kept out of the way for fear - That the Berghs had pistols with them - That he left the Berghs & Dops there - That Doughty was there - That there were two or three pistols on Board of ~~the~~ Dops Sloop - That the Dops & Berghs are called Tories, & that Doughty was once chosen of the Committee -

That a person who fell over out of a pettycouser said he had a letter to a Gentleman on board of one of the Vessels - his name Samuel <sup>he said he owed the</sup> ~~committee~~ <sup>he</sup> ~~was~~ <sup>de</sup> ~~and~~ <sup>that</sup> ~~there ~~was~~~~
