## **Oral History Project Introduction**

The Oral History Manual will be updated and available in the Lerch Homework Folder beginning early next week. In the meantime, you need to work with your parents to locate a suitable veteran to interview. A veteran should be located no later than Sept 5<sup>th</sup> if possible. The interview must be conducted by October 3<sup>rd</sup>. Talk to me if this presents any special problems.

## **Basic Time Frame for Project**

Quarter 1: Introduction / finding veteran and doing interview (Interview length is a minimum of 45 minutes. An hour or more is preferable!) Trust me on this!

Quarter 2: Transcribing the interview

Quarter 3: Polish final draft of interview and write essay

Quarter 4: Present PowerPoint highlights of veteran's story

## Whom should I ask for an interview?

Everyday more and more of the WWII veterans are passing away. In a just a couple more years they will either be gone or unable to tell their stories. Thus, these veterans remain our number one priority!

Consult with your parents first. Priorities exist . . .

- Is there a WWII family member who can tell a good story? (They do not have to live in Indiana!)
- If you locate a veteran who has *already* given an interview for the Library of Congress Veteran History Project, but NOT Park Tudor, they still may be interviewed if they are willing to do this. (This is a change in our policy, since we want their stories for our Legacy Initiative Project.)
- If you are not able to locate a WWII veteran, then one who served in the Korean War is the next choice. (Again, if they have told their story to LOC, but NOT PT, they are still eligible)
- Vietnam War third priority
- Gulf War is the last priority the individual cannot still be on active duty.

Where might I locate a veteran if there are none in my family?

• Ask neighbors, church groups, parents' jobs may have sources, and Mrs. Lerch is the absolutely LAST resort.

How do I know they will give a good interview with lots of information? Do a pre-interview over the phone if necessary. Pre-interview form will be on FirstClass as well.
